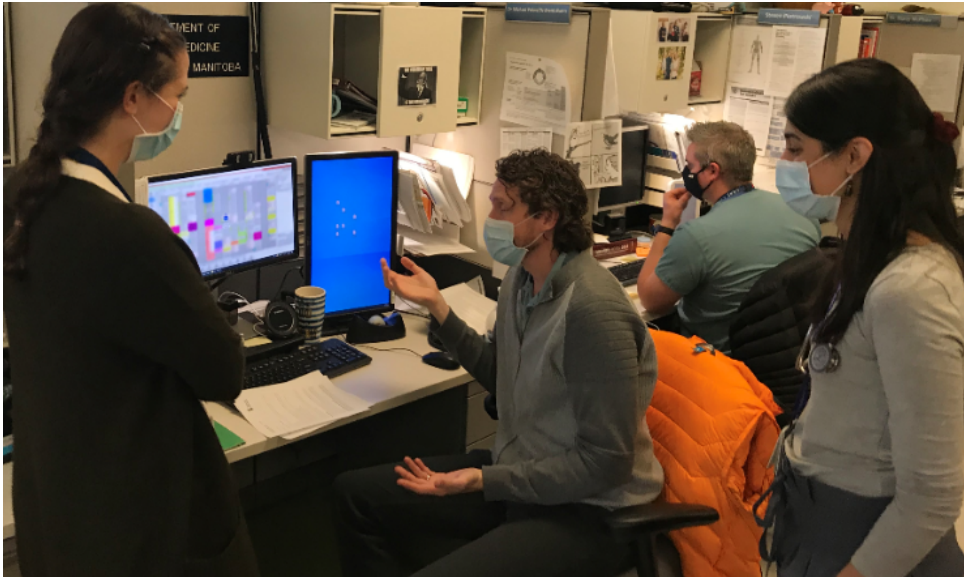

URBAN STREAM



In a diverse population of just over 700,000 people, you’ll find ample opportunities to make an impact. Experiences in family medicine are provided by your primary preceptor and can include outpatient and office-based care, home visits, caring for patients admitted to hospital, and following maternity patients through pregnancy.

During your residency at Seven Oaks Hospital’s Kildonan Medical Centre (KMC), ACCESS Fort Garry (AFG), ACCESS River East (ARE), or ACCESS Winnipeg West (AWW) you will participate in hospital rounds as well as in-clinic patient visits. This wide range of practice environments guarantees learning experiences alongside inter-professional faculty members such as dietitians, pharmacists and nurse practitioners.

You’ll also experience four weeks of Family Medicine Block Time (FMBT ) in rural Manitoba and eight weeks in a hospital medicine unit, helping you become a well-rounded family physician no matter where your future practice takes you. The variety of exposures across the urban stream allow you to fully explore the discipline of family medicine and identify where your strongest interests lie.

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FIRST YEAR

In first year, residents are paired with a primary preceptor and see a wide variety of patients. Five months of FMBT in the first year allows for continuity with a defined panel of patients. Time is also provided for self-directed learning.

\*FMBT: Over your two years of study, you will have exposures to a wide variety of rotations as an integrated part of Family Medicine Block Time. This includes Indigenous health, adult emergency, gynecology, obstetrics, pediatrics and psychiatry.

\*\* The four weeks allocated for vacation can be taken all at once or in two 2-week intervals in conjunction with electives.

SECOND YEAR

To ensure a well-rounded experience and education, four weeks are spent in a rural Manitoba community and eight in a family medicine managed hospital medicine clinical teaching unit. Protected time is provided for FMBT in psychiatry.

DIVERSE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS

A wide range of practice environments guarantees learning experiences alongside inter-professional faculty members such as dietitians, pharmacists and nurse practitioners.

Training occurs at Kildonan Medical Centre (KMC), ACCESS River East (ARE) ACCESS Fort Garry (AFG) and ACCESS Winnipeg West (AWW).

**KMC** is located in Seven Oaks General Hospital, which serves the ethnically diverse North End of Winnipeg. The hospital's mission places significant focus on wellness and health promotion. In keeping with this, attached to the hospital is a state-of-the-art fitness facility, the Wellness Institute. KMC includes six academic family physicians, one social worker, one dietitian and experienced nursing support.

**ARE** is a clinical teaching practice located in the East/ North Kildonan community of Winnipeg. Its collaborative team consists of five family physicians, two nurse practitioners, four nurses, one dietitian, one speech language pathologist, midwives, and shared care psychiatry/counselling.

**AFG** is a clinical teaching practice located in the Fort Garry community of Winnipeg. Its collaborative team consists of family physicians, nurse practitioners, registered nurses, dietician, clinical pharmacist and Mental Health Counseling Services.

**AWW** is a clinical teaching practice located in the Winnipeg West community of Winnipeg. Its collaborative team consists of family physicians, nurse practitioners, registered nurses, clinical psychologist, clinical pharmacist, occupational therapist, physiotherapist, registered dietitian, mental health, and Health Aging Resource Team.
