A note about the Teaching Development Program

A new Teaching Development Program has replaced TDP 1 and TDP 2. Residents who have previously completed TDP 1 and 2 do not have to complete this new course. Any residents who have only finished TDP 1 or TDP 2 will now have to complete the new Teaching Development Program.

This course covers the fundamentals residents need to teach medical students in the clinical setting including:

- 1) Learner Orientation
- 2) Assessment of Learners
- 3) Clinical Teaching
- 4) Giving Feedback
- 5) Learner in Difficulty

This course has been completely redone using new software and includes new videos featuring local learners.
