Parkland Family Medicine Scholarship

Dauphin has been home to a rural family medicine training program for almost 30 years. Dr. Jessica Sproule, one of the recent graduates of 2022, has made the Parkland program proud as a recipient of the *Family Medicine Resident Scholarship*. Only one resident doctor from each of the seventeen family medicine training programs is chosen and she is the recipient for the University of Manitoba. This award is given to residents who have shown outstanding leadership qualities. During her time in Dauphin she served as one of the chief residents with the important role of teaching including running simulation sessions for medical students and fellow residents.

When asked about this award and the training she received Dr. Sproule said, "The Parkland program prepares you to be a jack of all trades. On a daily basis you could deliver a baby, see patients in clinic, then do a shift in emergency. Residents come out of the program with so many skills. Most of us work rurally when we finish because we understand how important rural family medicine is. It's being able to help your patient in so many ways. I am honoured to receive this award especially on behalf of the Rural Parkland program because I am the physician that I am today because of the wonderful training I have had." Dr. Sproule is back to her home province of British Columbia helping a variety of rural communities including Terrace, Whistler and Haida Gwaii. Congratulations Dr. Sproule!
