### Participate in a study on leadership and teamwork.

University of Manitoba researchers (Dr. Gayle Halas and Dr Jitendra Singh) are conducting a study to explore the role of leadership and identify the nuanced differences between integrated or collaborative teamwork and multi-provider care, as well as the competencies and capacity required to lead interprofessional collaborative practice.
