### PUBLICATION Transition essentials

In an article published in the *CJC Pediatric and Congenital Heart Disease* journal, a team of researchers including faculty from the department of family medicine developed a series of recommendations for supporting patients and families transitioning from pediatric to adult congenital heart disease (CHD) care. The study, reported by Emily K. Hyde, Annette S.H. Schultz, Robin Ducas, Lori Lester, Shelly Mclarty, Anna M. Chudyk, and others, used a multilevel participatory process engaging individuals with CHD, their caregivers, and health care providers. Their collaborative process resulted in "Transition essentials," a guide on what support is needed, who should provide it, and how it should be provided to patients transitioning from pediatric to adult CHD care.

### Psychiatric consultation: Characteristics, satisfaction, and referrer perceptions of opportunities

Faculty members from the Department of Family Medicine, including Dorothy Yu, Alexander G. Singer, and others, have published a research study in the Canadian Family Physician (CFP) titled, "Psychiatric consultation: Characteristics, satisfaction, and referrer perceptions of opportunities." The study, featured in the July 2023 issue (Volume 69, Issue 7, Pages 481-489), sought to optimize referral methods to psychiatric services by assessing primary care provider referrals, satisfaction levels, and potential intervention opportunities. The researchers found that provider-patient factors and specific practice characteristics influenced referrals.
