## **Objectives: Indigenous Health**

- 1. Demonstrate a knowledge of Canada's colonial history and the impacts it had to First Nations, Metis and Inuit people.
- 2. Recognize one's own position, privilege, assumptions, stereotypes and or bias with regards to First Nations, Metis, and Inuit people and how this influences patient care.
- 3. Identify the levels of racism within the healthcare system and how they contribute to ongoing disparities in health outcomes for First Nations, Metis and Inuit people.
- 4. Recognize government and systemic policies in the past and present that are based on racist ideologies.
- 5. Examine what *Self-Determination* means to Indigenous people and how First Nations, Metis and Inuit people have been successful in becoming Self Determining societies.
- 6. Identify strategies or tools that can help one practice culturally safe and competent care to First Nations, Metis and Inuit people.
- 7. Propose ways to advocate for improvement in First Nations, Metis and Inuit health disparities.
- 8. Participate in dialogue and community engagement in an effort to build a mutually respective relationship with First Nations, Metis and Inuit people.
