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## **Objectives: Medical Competency**

- 1. In a patient with subtle signs of cognitive decline (e.g. family concerns, medication errors, repetitive questions, decline in personal hygiene),
  - a. Initiate assessment of mental competency, including use of a standardized tool
  - b. Refer for further assessment when necessary
- 2. In a patient with a diagnosis that may predict cognitive impairment (e.g. dementia, recent stroke, mental illness), identify those who require more careful assessment of decision-making capabilities.
- 3. When a patient is making decisions (e.g. surgery/no surgery, resuscitation status), think about the need to assess their mental competency.
- 4. In a patient with cognitive impairment, identify intact decision-making abilities, as many may be retained.
