For each on-site preceptor:

- Number of years in practice
- Hours worked each week in clinic / in hospital / on call
- Area of special interest
- Previous teaching experience
- o Familiarity with clinical precepting (direct observation, review of cases)
- Capacity for learners throughout year
- Specific scheduling issues (summers, holiday season)
- Other trainees in practice
- o Commitment to completing evaluation forms as Primary Preceptor
- o Academic appointment with Dept. of Family Medicine is active or has been initiated
- Interest in Research/Scholarly Activities
- Willingness to participate, and facilitate faculty development

Clinic-Based Practice

- Patients
 - Most common conditions
 - Age distribution:
 - Children & adolescents
 - Adults
 - Elderly
 - Prenatal/Postnatal
 - Indigenous
 - Underserved & vulnerable populations
 - Unique attributes
- Booking
 - Patients per day / per hour
 - Complete physicals
 - Same day / urgent care
 - Ease of booking patients with residents for follow-up
 - Adjustment of schedule to accommodate learners
- Clinic Staff
 - o Complement of staff
- Office configuration
 - Observation capability (camera, one-way mirrors)
 - o Space for residents/medical students (including internet access in clinic)
- Registered with Family Doctor Finder
