

University of Manitoba Family Medicine Research and Innovation Professorship

The Rady Faculty of Health Sciences, Department of Family Medicine (DFM) is inviting applicants for its first Professorship in **Research & Innovation**. The goal of the three (3) year professorship will be to provide research, scholarship, mentorship and leadership in Family Medicine. Academic work will focus on research leading to innovative delivery of primary care services consistent with the Patient Medical Home Model.

The successful candidate will establish and collaborate on research leading to innovation in the delivery of primary care with the goal of enhancing the quality of care and outcomes for individuals and communities. This will be achieved by expanding the current research being conducted within the DFM by participating and leading provincial, national and international peer-reviewed competitions for research funding in domains relevant to family medicine as well as mentoring and collaborating with trainees and new researchers pursuing careers in family medicine and primary care.

The Department of Family Medicine has created an initial endowment in salary support (funding equivalent to 0.2 GFT). The position is a three (3) year appointment with the possibility of renewing the Professorship for two (2) further three-year terms conditional upon available funds and a review of the incumbent's performance. The DFM will facilitate a full-time position incorporating a primary care clinical placement with the professorship GFT if the applicant does not have a current clinical position. The individual appointed is accountable to the Head of the Department of Family Medicine and the Director of Research and Quality Improvement. The expected start date is September 4, 2023, or on a mutually agreed upon date.

General and Specific Requirements:

- Canadian Citizen or permanent resident
- MD and CCFP designations
- Hold a current (or be eligible for) an academic appointment at the rank of Assistant, Associate or Full Professor in the Department of Family Medicine
- History of excellence in research as evidenced in high-quality research output, successful and promising research projects and programs, and significant contributions to the academic and clinical community at the local, national and/or international level
- Research experience, including preferably, a sustained track record of extramural funding as a principal investigator and peer-reviewed publications
- Track record of innovation
- Proven skills in leadership, mentorship, and student supervision
- Demonstrated ability to develop collaborations with intramural and extramural investigators and institutions
