

## 2021-22 Family Medicine Core Curriculum

Core Curriculum through University of Manitoba - PGME is a required part of your training.

Please refer to this email for program specific requirements for Family Medicine. Once the courses are completed, the residents receive credits in the Curriculum Management System within two business weeks. **NOTE – all PGME Core Curriculum should be completed 6 months prior to your completion of training date. Your completion of training will not be signed until this requirement is satisfied.**

**Teaching Development Program** – designed to give residents current teaching tools and skill sets to be more effective teachers in the clinical setting.

**TDP 0 (online):** This online course has been developed to meet an accreditation requirement of our medical school, ensuring our residents are oriented in the learning objectives of the medical student. Each resident regardless of training program or level will need to take this short course annually (both in PGY1 & PGY2 years).

**TDP (online):** This online course has been developed to train residents on Fundamentals of Teaching & Teaching in the Clinical Setting. All residents are required to complete this course in PGY1.

**CMPA Resident Education (online – live session):** CMPA will deliver a yearly seminar aiming to teach residents safe documentation, delegation and consenting. The seminar also aims to educate regarding how to respond to and cope with institutional or legal complaints. This course is targeted to the PGY1 trainee.

**Resource Stewardship (online):** This online course launched in July 2019 introducing the learner to the principals of resource stewardship. All residents will complete a self initiated

small project examining resource stewardship relevant to their practice. Further info will be provided during the lecture. Family Medicine residents are advised to complete in PGY1.

**Drug Prescribing Safety (online):** Aims to educate the learner regarding contemporary issues in prescription writing such as opiate prescribing, safety for patients and prescribers. As well, the privilege, responsibility and process of script writing in Manitoba will be explained. Any learner who wants to proceed to apply for script writing privileges will be able to do so after this seminar. Refer to the prescribing policy for additional info published within the Standards of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Manitoba.

**Conflict Management in Medicine (online):** This online course has been developed to provide residents with knowledge & skills to constructively manage conflict with patients and within teams. All residents are required to complete this course in PGY1.

**Professional Boundaries in the Physician-Patient Relationship (online):** After this session, the learner will be familiar with definitions of professional boundaries crossing and professional boundaries violations; concepts of fiduciary relationships, power differential, consent, etc; apply CPSM & CMA regulations regarding professional boundaries to a variety of scenarios & articulate ways in which to protect self from risk of violation. All residents are required to complete this course.

**Foundations of Professionalism** *\*note taking this at Family Medicine orientation in June already\** (online): This course will help residents understand rights & responsibilities in the learning environment, recognize the importance of professionalism & problematic behaviours that may arise. *There was time given to complete this course at orientation on June 30.*

**Practice Management (online – live session):** This course will be completed in the final year of residency. Family Medicine provides their own Practice Management sessions. If a resident cannot attend the Family Medicine session, the CMA Practice Management session can be attended through PGME.
