CaRMS TIPS FOR STUDENTS

TIMELINE & TIPS

***** All deadlines on the CaRMS website are based on Eastern Time (Ottawa).*****

In Manitoba, we are one hour behind (Eastern Time 12:00 PM = Central Time 11:00 AM). Don't leave tasks until the last minute — but if you do, be sure you're working according to *Ottawa time*, not local time!

June to August		 Attend the session - Road to CaRMS 1 on June 12th and the CaRMS Virtual School Presentation on August 21st. Ask lots of questions! Work on your CV and book a CV review session with Paula Hossack or the othercareer counsellors. To book an appointment with Career Consultant, Paula Hossack (Paula.hossack@umanitoba.ca) for CV/personal letter review, visit https://3630.waitwell.ca/ and click on the CaRMS button Visit the Casper (https://acuityinsights.app/casper/) and FmProc (https://fmproc.com/) websites to learn about these and make note of registration and test dates. Review last year's program descriptions for programs that interest you. They are usually similar year to year, so they can give you a "sneak peek" at this year's descriptions. September	Decision for the Conner test	 residency-match/program-descriptions/ Work on your CV and book a CV review session with Paula Hossack.
	Register for the Casper test	Visit https://acuityinsights.app/casper/
	10 Sep. 2025 at 12:00 pm ET CaRMS Online opens for applicants Program descriptions are available on carms.ca	 Review this year's program descriptions (PD). Review what type/format of personal letter each program wants and plan for those. Make note of anything extra or unusual in the PD (e.g. reference letter from a non-medical source)



September	Sep. 2025	•	Get your citizenship documents notarized and uploaded. You can do this through a transfer in your physiciansapply.ca account, but in our experience, the process is slow and sometimes leads to last-minute worry. The easiest way to certify your documents is to ask an attending physician on your elective to do this for you. Follow the directions here: https://carms.zendesk.com/hc/en-us/articles/115004169406-Who-can-notarize-or-certify-my-Citizenship-document The Student Affairs Physician Advisors are also happy to certify documents when you come for career counselling. Book an in-person appointment with us and bring your original documents with you. Transfer your CV to the CaRMS profile; this is a lot of cutting and pasting from your standard CV and takes longer than you think, so start early! Send reference letter requests for the referees you already know you need and make notes of them so you can send a reminder closer to the deadline. Work on your personal letters and make a personal letter review appointment with Paula Hossack. Visit https://3630.waitwell.ca/
	FmProc registration open	•	Please check the deadline and follow accordingly. No requests for registration or access to the test will be considered once the deadlines have passed.
	26 Sep. 2025 at 16:30 PM	•	You need to have the student submission portion of your MSPR done in Entrada by this date. Refer to emails from ugmemspr@umanitoba.ca about policies and procedures for the MSPR.
October		•	Finalize CV and CaRMS profile CV - remember you need to do both as some programs look only at one or the other, some look at both. Continue working on your personal letters. The Student Affairs Physician Advisors are also happy to review personal letters once you have gone through them with Paula Hossack or other career consultants. Get all reference letter requests out as early as possible
	Register for FmProc	•	If applying for Family Medicine, many programs require this test. https://fmproc.com/ No requests for registration or access to the test will be considered once the deadlines have passed
	15 Oct. 2025 DEADLINE: Translation requests for MSPR	•	This deadline is unlikely to apply to most MB med students, but if you are applying to French language residencies in Quebec, you may need to pay attention to this deadline
	16 Oct. 2025 at 12:00 (noon) ET Program selection opens.	•	Applicants can start selecting the programs to which they wish to apply and assigning requested documents. This would be a good time to make sure that the easy documents (e.g. citizenship docs) are uploaded and assigned. Keep working on CV and personal letters.
	FmProc Test	•	Take FmProc if you have registered.
	17 Oct. 2025 at 17:00 ET DEADLINE: Proof of citizenship/legal status through the Medical Council of Canada (MCC) for Canadian Medical Graduates and U.S Allopathic Medical Graduates	•	There are two options to prove your citizenship/legal status. If you choose the option of verifying your citizenship/legal status through the Medical Council of Canada (MCC), you must first register for a physiciansapply.ca account, apply for your MCCQE Part I examination, and send the required documents to the MCC no later than this date.



	14 Nov. 2025 DEADLINE: Transcripts and MSPRs sent by faculties	• This is a deadline for UGME, not you, but important to know as this is the last possible date for your MSPR to be uploaded. Comments and FITERs after this point for your last few electives will not be transmitted to programs
November	26 Nov. 2025 DEADLINE: Reference submission	 Your referees must submit their references for you by this date. It is a good idea to check around one week before to see if there are any missing references. If so, it is perfectly acceptable to send a polite email to the outstanding referees to remind them of the due date. After getting the references, send a polite email to each referee thanking them for supporting you.
	27 Nov. 2025 at 12:00 (noon) ET DEADLINE: Submission and assignment of applications and documents	 This is the big deadline for all your documents. There is no room/allowance for late entry- SA cannot help or pull any strings for you if you miss this date. Make sure everything is submitted well in advance! Programs will start to review the applications.
December	Early Dec. 2025	 Do interview prep with Career Consultant, Paula Hossack, or our Certified Coach, Jim McLaren. To make appointments with Paula, visit https://3630.waitwell.ca/. To make an appointment with Jim, visit https://studentaffairs.as.me/JimMclaren.
	13 Jan. 2026 DEADLINE: Interview offer status updates in CaRMS Online (prior to sending interview invitations)	 You will hear about interviews by this date at the latest but may hear earlier. Keep checking your Portal
January	17 Jan 8 Feb. 2026 National interview period	 The big show! Make sure you have done some interview prep with the career counselling team and participated in the Doctors Manitoba mock interviews in advance
	22 Jan. 2026 at 12:00 (noon) ET Ranking period begins	• You can start ranking programs on this date. Put in a tentative rank - it's not final until you finalize it. Starting early gives you time to reflect and adjust your choices.
February	19 Feb. 2026 at 15:00 ET DEADLINE: Applicant rank order list	 Applicants must submit their rank order list through CaRMS Online by 15:00 ET. This deadline is firm – no rank order lists can be submitted after this time. Get this done a day or two in advance and save yourself last-minute worry!!! We recommend "opting in" for UGME to receive your info on March 2nd if you go unmatched. This will allow us to meet and help you deal with this news before the big match celebration on March 3rd.
March	2 Mar. 2026 at 12:00 (noon) ET Pre-match day	 If you are unmatched and have "opted in", we will get that information on this date. We will call you in for meetings with Dr. Butler and Student Affairs staff on the day and help you through the second iteration
	3 Mar. 2026 at 12:00 (noon) ET MATCH DAY	• The big day! Match results are available through CaRMS Online. All your hard work will pay off and you will, hopefully, be matched with a great residency! We can't wait to celebrate with you!
